Report on the Standalone Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial statements of **ATL Textile Processors Limited** ('the Company'), which comprise the Balance sheet as at 31st March 2017, the Statement of profit and loss and the Cash flow statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.
